1	International Relations	ULS331	4	Regional Politics: The Middle East	Fall/5	The course aims to give the students a general understanding of what/where the Middle East is and of its various historical-political, socio-economic, cultural, ethnic and religious characteristics. It enables students to understand how certain Middle Eastern states were formed and analyze their emergence and development in historical context. In addition to investigating the internal dynamics of Middle Eastern states such as their political and economic structure, the course also analyzes the interaction of different Middle Eastern societies with each other and their impact on international politics. Thanks to the investigation of historical developments and the global political system, the course also helps the students to understand the current political situation in the Middle East. The course starts with a discussion of the region prior to World War I. We will analyze what the term “Middle East” means, its implications and connotations. Then we will continue with World War I, the collapse of the Ottoman Empire and the reshaping of the Middle East in its aftermath. Then we will move on to analyze the region during the interwar period and the Cold War years. Finally, we will focus on recent historical developments such as the Iranian Revolution, Iran-Iraq War, the Gulf Wars and the Arab Spring	Doç. Dr. Fulya ÖZKAN

Towards the mid-semester, we will analyze the emergence of nation-states, colonialism and the causes and consequences of World War I. In the second half of the course, we will focus on the 20th century and cover topics like the rise of fascism in the interwar period and the Cold War in the aftermath of World War II. Finally, we will end the semester with a quick overview of the post-Cold War developments.
